- 1. Solar panels may only be mounted on the roof of a structure. It is unacceptable to mount them on the ground (lot sizes are too small to permit that) or hanging from the roof or attached to the side of a building.
- 2. Solar PV (photo voltaic) panels must be installed by a licensed contractor, specifically certified to do Solar PV installations in the state of Delaware.
- 3. Installation plans, including specific layout information must be submitted to the WPPOA ARC for approval. The layout of the panels must be orderly and not haphazard.
- 4. All installations must have a county building permit and pass all required inspections by both the county and the Electricity provider, Delaware Electric Coop.
- 5. All solar PV panels must be all black.
- 6. No solar PV panels should be mounted on the front of the house. If other roof surfaces are insufficient, the ARC may consider some front mounted panels.
- 7. All solar PV panels must be mounted facing a direction which will result in efficient usage of the solar electric panels. This would be a southern, southwest or southeast exposure.
